- Power provided via Power over Ethernet (PoE) or local AC Adapter.
- Compatibility with Toshiba's entire family of Strata CIX IP business telephone systems, including CIX670, CIX200, CIX100, CIX40.
- Compatibility with Toshiba's older Strata CTX systems that support IP interface units.
